Arrive at Milton Keynes	Arrive early to make the most of day one	Drive or get a Supersaver train or coach ticket.
Morning	Start the day at the Milton Keynes Art Gallery. The city's successful and imposing gallery presents 6 - 8 exhibitions of contemporary and modern art a year.	Free entry
Mid Morning Campbell Park	Take a lovely walk through Campbell Park and view the stunning public art. Your journey will lead you to the MK shopping centre.	Free
Lunch	Milton Keynes shopping centre offers a range of eateries and cafes to suit all budgets.	
Afternoon	The Centre: MK is one of the UK's top five shopping centres, and one of the longest under-cover shopping areas in Europe.	
	There are over 230 shops from large national stores to smaller specialist shops. On the southern side of the building there is an open market on Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays, and an antiques and bric-a-brac market on Thursdays.	
	The Centre: MK also offers a crèche facility for children.	
Late afternoon	Back to the Travelodge to freshen up for evening	
Evening	There are over 350 restaurants to choose from for dinner at in Milton Keynes.	
	Visit Xscape, a prime entertainment destination, combining Europe's largest indoor 'real snow' ski slope, an indoor rock climbing wall, 16 screen cinema multiplex, and family entertainment centre which includes ten pin bowling bars, restaurants and cafes. Morning	Start the day by visiting the Concrete Cows - One of Milton Keynes "must see" sights.	Free entry
	Close by to the concrete cows is the Roman Villa at Bancroft – see the preserved remains of a real-life Roman villa.	Free entry
	The plan of the villa is set out with low brick walls. The on-site interpretation boards explain Roman life and what each of the rooms were used for.	
Lunch	Relax and take a picnic and sit along side the Grand Union Canal or stop for lunch at one of the lovely canal- side pubs with a beer garden.	
Afternoon	Visit Willen Lakeside Park for a gentle stroll around the lake. Participate in water sports or sit and watch the cable tow water skiers. There's lots of fun and free activities to do with the family: Feed the ducks or use the bird hide and view the varied bird life on the lake. Have a walk around the maze and see who can find the exit first! Visit the Peace Pagoda, built by monks and nuns of Myohoji surrounded by an ornate Japanese garden. This was the first Peace Pagoda to be built in the western hemisphere.	Free
